A. Down the road, towards Church Avenue.

Q. What did the defendant tell you happened after that?

A. Tony jumped out, starting beating Mark, Mark fought back, Tony shot him then beat him more.

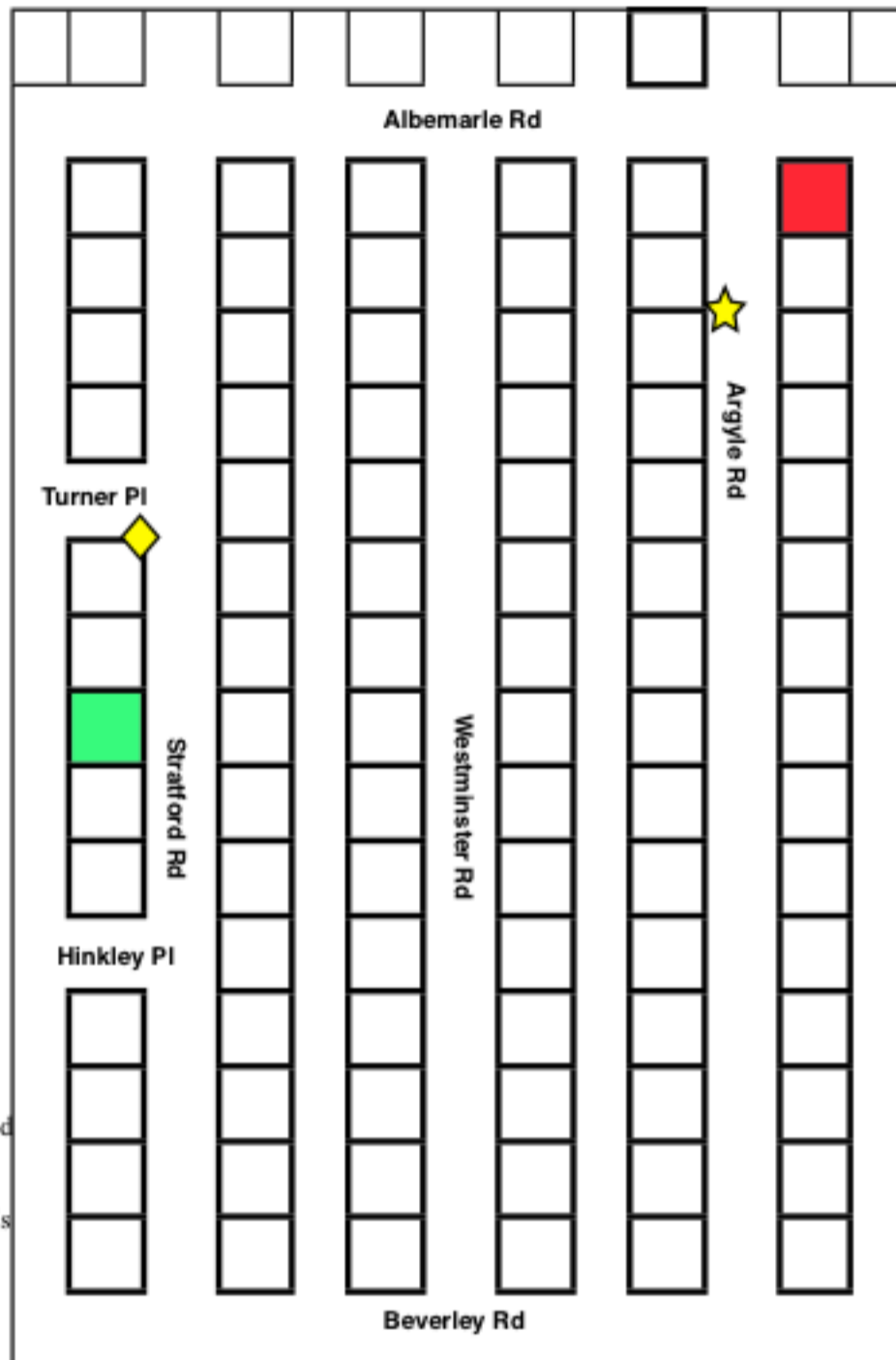

Q. You don't know where he was shot, sir?

A. No.

Q. You don't know after all this time and speaking to these DAs and reading the newspaper, you don't know that he was shot in front of 150 Argyle? Is that your testimony, sir?
